A MESSAGE FROM KC CARES KC VILLAGE ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP LOOKING BEYOND HONEYBEES

What do you think of when you hear the word pollinator? Many people think of honeybees. Although honeybees are important for some agricultural crops, they are an introduced species from Europe. Our native bees actually pollinate many of our foods, and Maryland has over 400 native species of bees and 150 species of butterflies. These native pollinators are declining with the loss of habitat and increasing pesticide use. Simple practices in your yard can support native pollinators and honeybees:

• Plant a variety of native plants. Plant clusters of flowering plants that bloom across the seasons, from early spring through fall. Native shrubs and trees are also host plants for important



pollinators, such as the pawpaw tree for zebra swallowtail butterflies (see photo)

Avoid pesticides

 Leave plant stems and leaves in place over winter to provide shelter

 \Rightarrow Columbia Card holders can visit any CA facility throughout the year & pay a reduced daily fee.






