#### **A MESSAGE FROM KC CARES** KC VILLAGE ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP Winter Wonderlands for Wildlife



Winter can be a cozy time for your family, with warm socks and mugs of hot chocolate, but it's a tough time to be living outdoors! You can help birds, bees, butterflies, and

other creatures survive the winter by providing food and shelter in your yard.

**Leaving the leaves:** many of our native pollinators overwinter safely tucked in a blanket of leaves on the ground. Birds and small critters like squirrels can find meals in the leaf litter too.

**Saving the stems:** letting dead flower heads stay standing in your yard provides seeds for birds as well as habitat for many of our native bees, who lay their eggs in hollow stems of native plants.

# SIDEWALK MAINTAINANCE

**Please remember...**if your property has a sidewalk along the *SIDE OR REAR* property line (even if the sidewalk area is behind a fence) it is your responsibility to mow the grass,

rake the leaves and **shovel snow** in this area. You are responsible for maintaining the sidewalk and grassy areas so that it is safe for public use.

Howard County code, Section 18.402(a) and (h).

### **RECYCLE HOLIDAY TREES**

Prepare your tree for recycling by removing all ornaments, garlands, lights, tinsel, plastic bags, or any other artificial materials. Live trees are taken to the Alpha Ridge Landfill to be recycled into compost and mulch. Recycle your tree on your normal recycling day through January 20. Trees will not be collected on trash days.

# YARD TRIM COLLECTION
