Thirty-four kids participated in this year's kids' vote. The winner is the penguin, which will be a adopted from the Maryland Zoo in Baltimore.



A MESSAGE FROM KC CARES KC VILLAGE ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP NATIVE PLANTS FOR NEGLECT



Some planting locations are particularly challenging for gardeners. Cul-de-sacs and 'hell strips' (the narrow patch between the sidewalk and street) are often hot, dry, and often suffer from neglect. While many

plants wither in these conditions, some 'tough as nails' natives can thrive in these areas. These plants will still benefit from watering when recently transplanted but should be quite resilient once established. Recommended plants that can handle heat, drought, and full or part sun include:

- Coneflower (Echinacea purpurea)
- Baptisia (Baptisia australis)
- Blazing Star (Liatris spicata)
- Yarrow (Achillea millefolium)
- Threadlèaf Coreopsis 'Zagréb' (Coreopsis verticillata)
- Threadleaf Bluestar (Amsonia hubrichtii)
- Butterfly Weed (Asclepia tuberosa)
- Black or Brown-Eyed Susans (*Rudbeckia hirta & triloba*)


