

A MESSAGE FROM KC CARES KC VILLAGE ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP Fireflies in the Fall



Do you love seeing fireflies in your yard during the summer? If so, Fall is an important time to make sure they have the habitat they need to thrive.

Firefly larvae are already in your yard—underground, in the leaves, and nestled in logs—feeding on garden pests like slugs and snails. To protect them and help them live through the winter, leave your leaves in place, use them as mulch in garden beds, or pile them up in a designated section of your yard. Don't rake leaves and put them on the curb. You are raking up firefly larvae and throwing them away! Other tips for creating a firefly friendly habitat:

- Avoid pesticides and fertilizers, which can poison the prey that firefly rely on.
- Modify light fixtures to ensure that fireflies and other nocturnal critters can enjoy darkness.
- Plant native plants of different heights, including grasses and shrubs.

CA CA BUDGET PROCESS

Welcome to the Columbia Association Fiscal Year (FY) 2027 budget process, a chance for you to provide feedback on CA's priorities investments. CA's FY2027 begins May 1, 2026 and ends April 30, 2026.

The Board is scheduled to start discussing the FY2027 budget during its regularly scheduled Board Meeting on September 25 @ 7pm, where they will narrow down top priorities and vote on those at the meeting on October 23 @ 7pm. Residents are always welcome to participate in Resident Speakout, which happens at the start of every Board meeting. These meetings are also live streamed and recorded on YouTube.

In addition to Board meetings, you will also have a chance to offer your input online from November 14-Decembér 2.

Anyone looking to affect change in the budget should get involved in the early part of the process and let the Board know what your priorities are for CA.
