A MESSAGE FROM KC CARES KC VILLAGE ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP **LEAVE THE LEAVES!**



Leaves falling in the autumn are a key part of the natural cycle of our local ecosystem; a blanket of insulation. leaves provides 🖁 habitat, nutrients, and improves the soil. Pollinators (and fireflies!) depend on fallen leaves

to survive the winter, and birds hunt among them for delicious insects. Leaves suppress weeds, improve soil structure and nutrient content, and retain moisture. Instead of hauling away leaves in the fall and then hauling in fertilizer and mulch in the spring, you can reap the benefits of the leaf layer by just leaving them where they lay.

Got lawn? No problem! A thin layer of leaves won't hurt yoʻur grass, but yoʻu can rake abundant leaves into garden beds or around trees. No need to shred or mow; piling the leaves will compress them and speed the natural process of decomposition.

The Board began discussing the FY2027 budget during its September 25 Board Meeting. The Board will continue to discuss the budget at their November 13 meeting. Residents are always welcome to participate in Resident Speakout, which happens at the start of every Board meeting. The Board meetings are also live streamed and recorded on YouTube.

In addition to Board meetings, you have a vour input online from chance to offer November 14-December 2.

Anyone looking to affect change in the budget should get involved in the early part of the process and let the Board know what your priorities are for CA.

PACKAGE DELIVERY SAFETY TIPS

Reports of "porch pirates" who brazenly steal packages off of front doorsteps, are all too common. When shopping from online retailers, Howard County Police Department reminds residents to plan ahead to avoid becoming a victim of package theft.

- Consider installing a doorbell camera that notifies you when someone comes to your door.
- Track your packages and try to be home when they are scheduled to arrive. If you can't be home, ask a neighbor or friend to pick up the package until you return.
- Use an alternative delivery option, such as an Amazon locker or an attended pickup location.
- Request that the delivery service place the package in a location that can't be seen from the sidewalk, such as at a side or back door.
- Install a lockbox, a sturdy, secure container for delivery personnel to place your packages that locks after drop off.
- When you are home, bring packages inside immediately after delivery.
- Look out for your neighbors and report suspicious activity on your street. Contact HoCo Police Dept. by calling 911 or the non-emergency number 410-313-2200.
