A MESSAGE FROM KC CARES KC VILLAGE ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP Creating Winter Structure in the Landscape

Leaving leaves in the garden over the winter is a great first step to support soil structure and provide support for overwintering insects. However, there are additional steps you can take to create winter structure that both looks attractive and supports animals. Leaving plant stems standing—especially the hollow stems of perennials like coneflowers and Joe-Pye weed—can provide insects like native bees a place to overwinter. Seedheads on ornamental grasses and perennials like asters and sunflowers provide beautiful shapes when covered with frost and also feed birds through the winter. If


you want to go a step further, a simple pile of sticks in a quiet corner provides shelter for overwintering animals like toads, small mammals, and insects. Holding back on the fall cleanup is a simple step to support animals over the winter and can be more attractive than a bare garden until spring.

Our Office of Consumer Protection is sharing this warning from the Federal

Trade Commission about gift card scams. A favorite amongst criminals, scammers will tell their victims a range of different stories - that they're from the government, tech support, or your utility company, a friend or family member with an emergency, you've won a prize, and more, through call, text, email, or social media message to get you to buy gift cards so they can steal your money. Remember, gift cards are for gifts and only gifts, not for payments. NEVER buy a gift card because someone tells you to buy one and give them the numbers.
