A MESSAGE FROM KC CARES KC VILLAGE ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP Winter Salt and Spring Ponds



Melted snow and ice from the winter flow into spring ponds that are home to our frogs and other aquatic life. But the salt we use on sidewalks and streets creates a toxic runoff that is absorbed in the groundwater and in freshwater ponds, streams and rivers, making them unsafe for many amphibians and fish. Salt also erodes cement and steel (i.e., your driveway and car), kills plants, is toxic to pets, and poisons our drinking water.

Fortunately, there are great alternatives:

- Shovel or sweep your driveway and let the sun melt or evaporate any remaining snow
- In shady areas or where the snow doesn't melt and you need traction, plain sand or cat litter usually does the job.
- Coffee grinds or ash from your fireplace provide both grit and a dark color, increasing the rate of melting
- Pickle juice can be used to melt small areas of ice

TAX TIPS

1. **File early** to avoid identity thieves who use stolen social security numbers to file tax returns.
2. **Check out your preparer.** Make sure your preparer is properly licensed by going to DLLR's website: DLLR.State.MD.US/PQ/
3. **Avoid refund anticipation loans.** Fees and interest will be deducted from your refund.
4. **Stay alert for IRS imposters.** The **IRS does not call taxpayers** who owe back taxes. Hang up if the caller asks for immediate payment, even if Caller ID says IRS.
