**This spring, KC CARES is giving out 150 Micropond Kits to Kings Contrivance residents.**

Wildlife depends on water for habitat and sustenance, and even a pond as small as a kitchen mixing bowl can provide these valuable resources.

#### **Check out our demonstration ponds!**

KC CARES Weed Warriors recently installed a large and a small micropond in one Adopt-a-Spot in each KC neighborhood:

- Yellow Bonnet Adopt-a-Spot
- South Carlinda Bridge Adopt-a-Spot
- Sea Shadow Bridge Adopt-a-Spot

With a micropond, you get to watch the fun of tadpoles, dragonflies, frogs, and salamanders in your own yard. Kits include 7 deer-resistant native plants, Mosquito Bits to prevent mosquitoes, complete instructions, and a small stainless steel pond basin in one of three sizes.

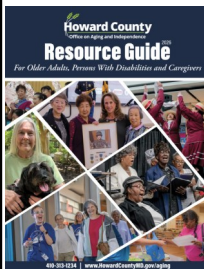
## VILLAGE BOARD
